Sir,

On the 3rd August, 1961, travel notifications in respect of the above-named Soviet diplomatic officials were received at this Office. Observations were arranged with the following result.

These officials arrived in this City at about 7 p.m. on Sunday, 6th August, 1961, driving an Austin motor car TYE. 978.

At 8.15 p.m. they left the Hotel at which accommodation had been arranged - Duke of Cornwall Hotel - and drove around the Millbay, Stonehouse and Devonport areas. During this time they showed some interest in the Dockyard at Devonport, where the car was parked for several minutes whilst they were overlooking the various installations. They then drove to The Hoe area where they left the vehicle and walked around looking at the sea front. Eventually they again entered their car and then drove around the City Centre area returning to their hotel where they remained for the night.

The following day, Monday, 7th August, they left the Hotel at 10.45 a.m. and drove around The Hoe and sea front area, returning to their hotel again at 12.15 p.m.

At about 2.40 p.m. they again left the hotel dressed in uniform to make an official visit to the Navy Days Exhibition at the Royal Naval Barracks, H.M. Dockyard, Devonport. At about 7 p.m. they left the Royal Naval Barracks and returned to their hotel. At 10 p.m. they again left the hotel and visited the Officers' Club at Mount Wise in a British naval car, accompanied by various Naval Officers who had been in their company during the whole afternoon and evening. These Officers are Lieut. Commander SALMON, Lieut. Commander WEST and Lieut. HARVEY.

After leaving the Officers' Club they then visited the home of Lieut. Commander WEST where they were entertained until 4.15 a.m. at which time they returned to their hotel.

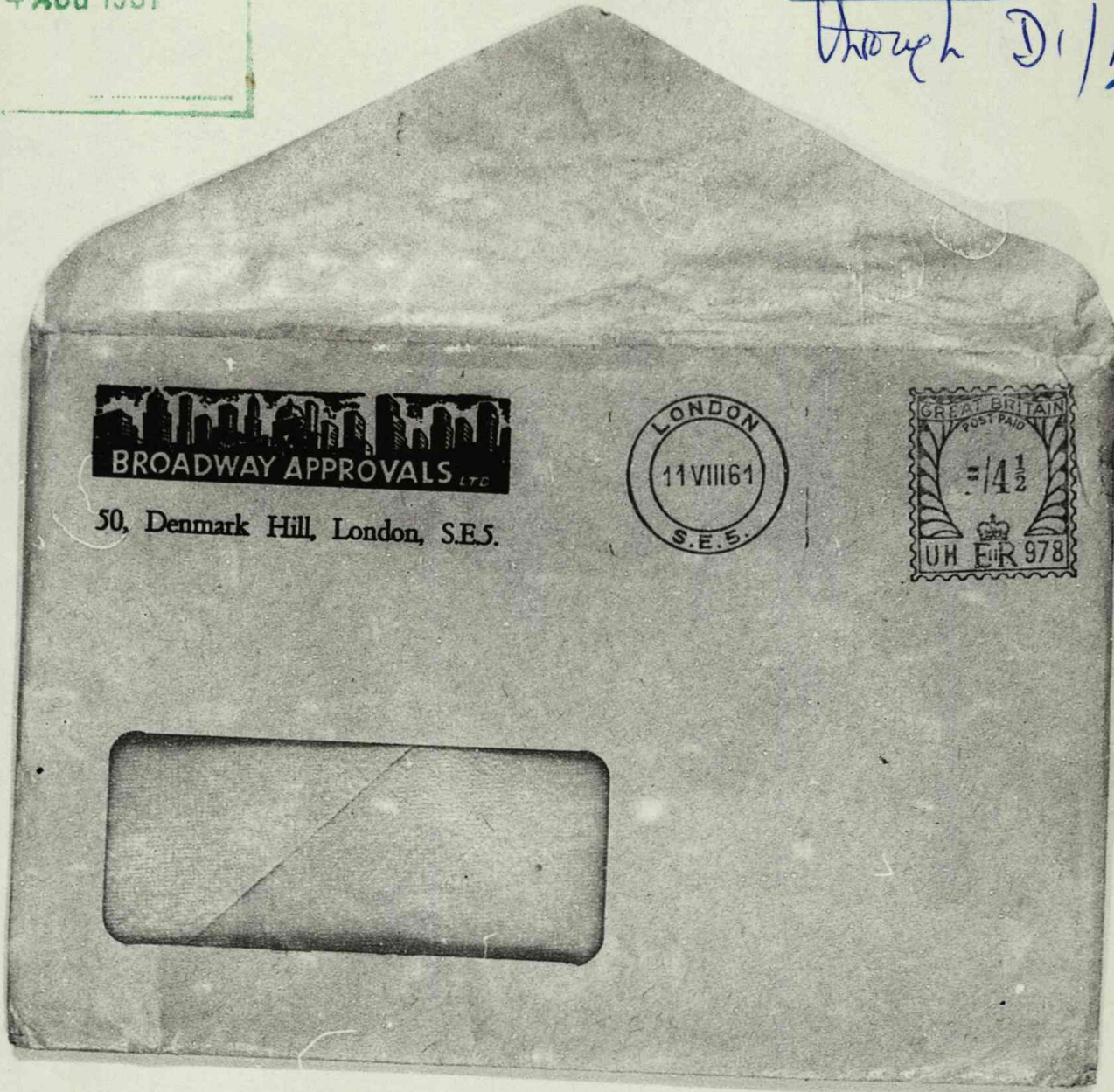

Correspondence has been received from the Director General, Security Service, giving notice of a visit to this City of Commander IVANOV and Lieut. Commander SHEVYREV of the U.S.S.R. Embassy, in black Austin motor car, TYE 978.

These persons were seen in Chichester Road and Kingston Road, at 5.40 p.m. on Friday, 4th August 1961, going southwards. At 5.55 p.m. that day they booked in at the Royal Beach Hotel, staying there over night.

At 2.30 p.m. on Saturday, 5th August, they were escorted in uniform into H.M. Dockyard, by Royal Naval Staff Officers, returning to the hotel at 6.45 p.m.

They were not observed moving about the City until the following morning, when they left in the direction of Southampton.

I respectfully ask that this report be forwarded to the Director General, Box No: 500, Parliament Street Box Office, London, S.W.1., for his information.

REPORT ON RUSSIAN AND RUMANIAN VISITORS

References: (a) A.M. 071727Z
(b) A.M. 121445Z

The following reports on the Russian and Rumanian visitors to Brawdy's Air Day on 15th July are forwarded in accordance with the references.

2. Russian Party

IVANOV - 3rd Rank Captain. Very cheerful, friendly, puts on the simple sailor act, but in fact very shrewd. His English was quite good.

SHEVYREV - Captain Lieutenant. Less bright. A dour type of Russian. His English was less good.

Both Seaman Officers ("deck" officers). Both finished Higher Naval Training College. Both learnt English in Naval College.

3. Subjects on which questions were asked:

1. Technical Competence of the Indians. Relations between British and Indian personnel; details of Indians' training.
2. Squadrons' numbers, emblems, bases, types of aircraft.
3. Self-sufficiency of squadrons - administration.
4. Details of Naval Air Training.
5. Which aircraft carry atomic weapons.
6. Capability of station to carry out maintenance and major refits of aircraft.
7. Functions of buildings, especially hangars.
8. Strictness of discipline.
9. Length and construction of runways - what types of aircraft could use it.
10. Complement of Station and recruitment.
11. Details of host officers' service background.
12. Details of Sub. Lt. RYAN's home and Educational background. They made four attempts to get his address.

13. Where is training in rocket firing done.
14. Are the beaches good for bathing. They noted that local beaches were deserted and enquired whether they were safe.

4. Other subjects in which interest was shown

1. German Training Base.
2. They were very keen on taking a pleasure flight. Wanted to take photographs but were not permitted. Did not want to take an officer with them but RYAN insisted on accompanying them. They paid his fare.
3. They photographed a SEA VIXEN with FIRESTREAK fitted. IVANOV posed against it with his hand on missile as a scale indicator. (He did this before anyone had a chance to prevent him).

5. Other Points

1. Both Russians professed ignorance of aviation and missiles. This was largely a pose although IVANOV did not appear to know the Russian technical terms for missiles (e.g. semi-active, beam-riding, etc.).
2. When IVANOV realised RYAN's technical Russian was good, in particular when he saw his reaction to his posed photograph of the Firestreak he tended to avoid questioning him and concentrated on the Station Officer, a Special Duties List Lieutenant. SHEVYREV twice tried to split the two conducting officers so that they could not back up each others stories.
3. IVANOV insisted that RYAN must have a drink with him in London and again tried to get his address. The Station officer was also invited to have a drink with them in the evening after Air Day. This invitation was politely declined.
4. It was their first visit to a Naval Air Station but SHEVYREV mentioned that he had twice been in Scotland in the last month or so.
5. Both smoke. Both drink and like English Beer.
6. They apparently avoided contact with the Rumanian attache.

6. Answers given to their questions

No information of any security value was given to the officers. The answers were confined to information which has already been released to the Press or was given in the commentary or the programme. They did not seem to be put off by being told that information could not be released.

7. RUMANIAN PARTY

Colonel G. DINCULESCU - a tough looking partisan - type army officer. He is a specialist in Artillery, and appeared to be genuinely on holiday on this occasion. A cheerful character. Spoke good English.

Mrs. DINCULESCU - very charming, spoke fair English, but did not question the officer conducting them on any Service matters. Was accompanied by her small son who was on school holidays; he is normally at school in Rumania. They have one other small child aged one year in London. The son did not speak English at all, and his mother spent much time speaking to him in Rumanian.

Mr. V. Androne - Officially the Colonel's driver and general aide. He appeared to be rather more than this, and took a number of photographs of general views of exhibits. He did not attempt to get any posed photographs as did the Russians. He spoke some English, but generally avoided conversation with the conducting officer. During the flying display he took notes, though these could not have been from the commentary since this was not clearly audible from where he was sitting.

CONFIDENTIAL8. Subjects in which interest was shown:

1. Colonel DINCULESCU did not ask nearly as many questions as did the Russians. He showed considerable interest in the THUNDERBIRD missile which he identified without difficulty at some distance.
2. He showed particular interest in the Indian Squadron and their aircraft, and did not appear to be aware that they possessed a Fleet Air Arm.
3. He enquired the parent bases of the Squadrons who were performing on the day. (This information was in fact given in the commentary).
4. He did not go for a pleasure flight, but said his son would like to go up. He was dissuaded from this by the waiting time for flights.

9. Relations with the Russian Party:

He also wished to avoid contact with the Russian party. It was difficult to say whether this antipathy was based upon genuine dislike of each other, or whether it was the "Party Line" to split the host officers or simply to prevent the Rumanians from gaining the same information as the Russians.

10. General:

Both teams seemed to enjoy their visit. Their purpose seemed to be to gain any information they could about the Station and its future, and also probably to corroborate information which they may have obtained from study of maps and perhaps from agents in this country. It is unlikely that they gained any information not already in their possession concerning aircraft and weapons, though the visit was probably worthwhile in giving them first hand experience of a Fleet Air Arm Station and a view of the local area during their pleasure flight.

- Ivanov. Very bright, friendly and talkative. Also very shrewd. English average to good (especially on technical vocabulary).
- Shevrev. Far less talkative and apparently not so bright. Carried camera. English poor.

Neither would say much about his own background except that they were both seaman ("Deck") officers and had both finished the higher Naval College. Shevrev had learnt English on a naval course. Both professed ignorance of anything to do with aviation (however their questions were sometimes quite technical). Also claimed to know nothing about missiles. This was probably genuine because although some questions were asked, neither seemed familiar with the Russian technical vocabulary on the subject. Also Ivanov went to some trouble to get himself photographed posing with one hand on a Firestreak rocket. The dimensions of this rocket are I believe already well known.

1. Bases of squadrons and aircraft in display.
2. Function of base.
3. Number of squadrons and aircraft on station—insignia and emblems.
4. When were Indians to leave and who was to replace them.
5. Technical competence of Indians and personal relations between Indian and British personnel.
6. How strict is discipline.
7. How many service men on station and how many civilians.
8. What is function of various buildings on airfield.
9. Length and construction of runways. What types of aircraft can use them.
10. How many of the aircraft on display can carry atomic bombs.
11. Names of senior officers on station.
12. Details of training and squadron organisation.
13. Can station carry out all its own maintenance and repair.
14. Why were there no bathers on beach - is it dangerous.
15. Where is training in rocket firing done.
16. Did we know anything about the Germans training at Castlemartin.
17. What are our own duties.

Other points

1. Ivanov insisted on taking a pleasure trip in a light aircraft (although it cost him £3 for three minutes). He asked to be allowed to take photographs - this was refused. During the flight the only questions he asked were about the beaches.
2. When Ivanov realised that my knowledge of technical Russian was fairly good he seemed to get a little suspicious of me and concentrated on the Lieutenant who was acting as guide and even invited him out to dinner. Shevrev tried to separate us on several occasions to leave Ivanov with the Lieutenant.
3. Both were very interested in my personal background and tried four times to get my address. They said they would like to go out for a drink with me sometime in London. When I mentioned that I had once been to a party at the Embassy, Ivanov said I must be invited again. I told him any invitations could be sent via the Admiralty.
4. Beyond a brief formal exchange of greetings, the two Russians noticeably avoided any contact with the Rumanian attaché who was also visiting the station.

Correspondence has been received from the Director General of the Security Service, respecting a visit of the above named to this City.

Observations were kept so far as was practicable and it was found that these persons arrived at the Pendragon Hotel, Clarence Parade, Southsea, at 6.45 p.m. Thursday, 27th April 1961. They had not previously reserved accommodation.

They left the hotel on the following morning and at 11.55 a.m. on the Sea Front they were attempting to obtain a boat trip in the harbour. However, they were unsuccessful as the pleasure boat season has not yet commenced. They afterwards drove to Old Portsmouth and were seen in High Street about noon. They then drove into Commercial Road, going northwards and turning into Wharf Road, which is a cul-de-sac, ending in a quay, which affords a view of the North Wall of H.M. Dockyard and of H.M.S. Excellent. In a few minutes they returned to the main road and proceeded northwards through Twyford Avenue, where contact was lost.

The car was subsequently seen parked outside the Pendragon Hotel, but no further movement was observed until 9.30 a.m. on Saturday, 29th April 1961, when they left the hotel and drove out of the City, stopping on the way for petrol.

They left the City at 10 a.m. driving northwards on route A.3.

The subjects were not observed to make any contacts.

I beg to refer to letter, dated 20th. April, 1961, from The Director General of the Security Service, forwarding Personality Sheets and travel notification in respect of (1) Captain Evgeni Mikhailovich IVANOV and (2) Captain Ivan Pavlovich SAKULKIN.

During the night of the 24th/25th. April, 1961, these men stayed at the 'Hawthorns' hotel, Clifton, Bristol, and left at approximately 9am. on the morning of Tuesday, 25th. April, 1961. As previously arranged with Det. Sgt. CLARKE, Bristol Constabulary, SAKULKIN and IVANOV were followed to the Somerset County boundary at Whitchurch, Nr. Bristol, where I took over 'escort duty' through the County.

At 9.25am. 25th. April, Austin A.105, black saloon entered Whitchurch, driven by SAKULKIN. IVANOV was passenger in the front of the car. I followed the vehicle along the notified route to Old Down Filling Station where they stopped to refuel. Neither SAKULKIN nor IVANOV got out of the car at the filling station. They were served with petrol by a female attendant.

Their journey continued along the notified route, via Ilchester and Ilminster, through mainly rural areas of no apparent security interest, except for the Royal Naval Air Station at Yeovilton which, although adjacent to the main A.303/A.30 roads at Ilchester, is not visible from these roads at that point. They made no attempt to deviate from their notified route at Ilchester, nor in fact at any point through the County.

I stopped the vehicle at Horton Cross, Nr. Ilminster. I approached SAKULKIN, the driver of the vehicle and it was obvious that he was not allowed to answer any questions that I might put to him, as IVANOV requested that I should speak to him. IVANOV produced his copy travel notification and both men produced their identity documents which were in order.

I asked IVANOV if he was in possession of any cameras and he replied, "Yes", but when I followed this by asking whether they were 'cine' or 'still' cameras he said, "I am not allowed to answer that question!" I did not pursue the matter. He declined to give any reason for their visit and again the matter was not pursued.

It was apparent to me that whatever camera(s) they had in their possession were in the boot of the car unless they were concealed in a raincoat on the back seat of the car.

Before producing any documents or answering any questions, IVANOV made a written note of my name, number etc., and also made a written note of everything I said to him. Apart from making some comment on the adverse weather, SAKULKIN did not speak. Both men were quite pleasant in their manner. Before continuing their journey, IVANOV stated his intention of stopping at Exeter for lunch.

They continued their journey into Devon, from Ilminster, followed by a Road Motor Patrol car from Taunton, without incident.

On the 21st April, 1961, Travel Notifications in respect of the two above-named Soviet Officials were received at this Office. During their stay in this City they were kept under close surveillance.

On Tuesday, 25th April, 1961, at about 3.5 p.m. these two officials were seen to arrive at Harrowbeer, near Yelverton, in close proximity to a former R.A.F. war time aerodrome which the Plymouth City Council intend to convert into a civil airport. They parked their car TYE.978, got out and looked around. They showed some interest in this site.

Shortly after they re-entered the car, continued on their journey and entered the City. On arrival at Crownhill they turned and drove around the extremities of the Plumer Barracks which house the Lancashire Regiment.

They then drove into the City Centre where they entered Messrs. W.H. SMITH & Son, Newsagents, where they showed some interest in photographs and maps of the City. They did not make any purchase. They did a similar thing at another local newsagent's shop.

At 4.10 p.m. they went to the Continental Hotel where they booked their accommodation as shown on the notifications. At this Hotel one of the receptionists, who was formerly employed at the Green Dragon Hotel, Hereford, claims to have recognised IVANOV as a person who had stayed at her former hotel some five weeks ago, in company with three other Russian officials.

At about 4.30 p.m. both officials left the hotel and drove around the Millbay Dock area on to Devonport where they entered a local park which overlooks H.M. Dockyard. They showed some interest in this Dockyard and some time later departed to visit the Torpoint Ferry. They then drove back to the Millbay Dock area where they showed some interest in the various entrances to the docks and surrounding area. They next visited the Hoe area overlooking Plymouth Sound seeing various shipping at anchor and the R.A.F. Station at Mount Batten.

At 6.15 p.m. they returned to the hotel for meals and refreshment. Whilst in the hotel bar it was noticed that both men were drinking pints of beer with a vodka as a chaser, they were seen to consume three each of these double drinks.

After dinner they spoke to one of the hotel porters and asked for advice as to how they could best spend their time that evening. The porter suggested a visit to a licensed hotel and ballroom. They remarked to the porter that they were interested in both pastimes.

They left the hotel again at about 8 p.m. and did in fact visit a local hotel which houses a public ballroom but their visit was merely confined to the bar. They did not enter the dance hall.

They returned to the hotel premises again, entered their car and drove around the City area displaying interest again in the docks, Plymouth Sound and Sutton Harbour areas, returning to their hotel at about 9.15 p.m.

They did not leave the hotel again that night.

The following day at 9.5 a.m. they left their hotel and after cleaning their car drove to the Devonport Dockyard area where they seemed interested in the Dockyard boundaries and gate entrances. They continued their drive then to the Saltash Ferry where they showed great interest in the construction of the Tamar Bridge which is nearing completion. Here they left the car and after consultation with a large map walked around and spent some time viewing both the bridge and the river and also Dockyard installations nearby.

Eventually they left this area and then drove out of the City leaving the City Boundary at about 10.25 a.m. en route for Exeter on the A.38 road. Whilst in the City they made no contacts.

There is little doubt that this visit was certainly not a holiday and was one of their usual intelligence by observation and familiarisation with ports missions.

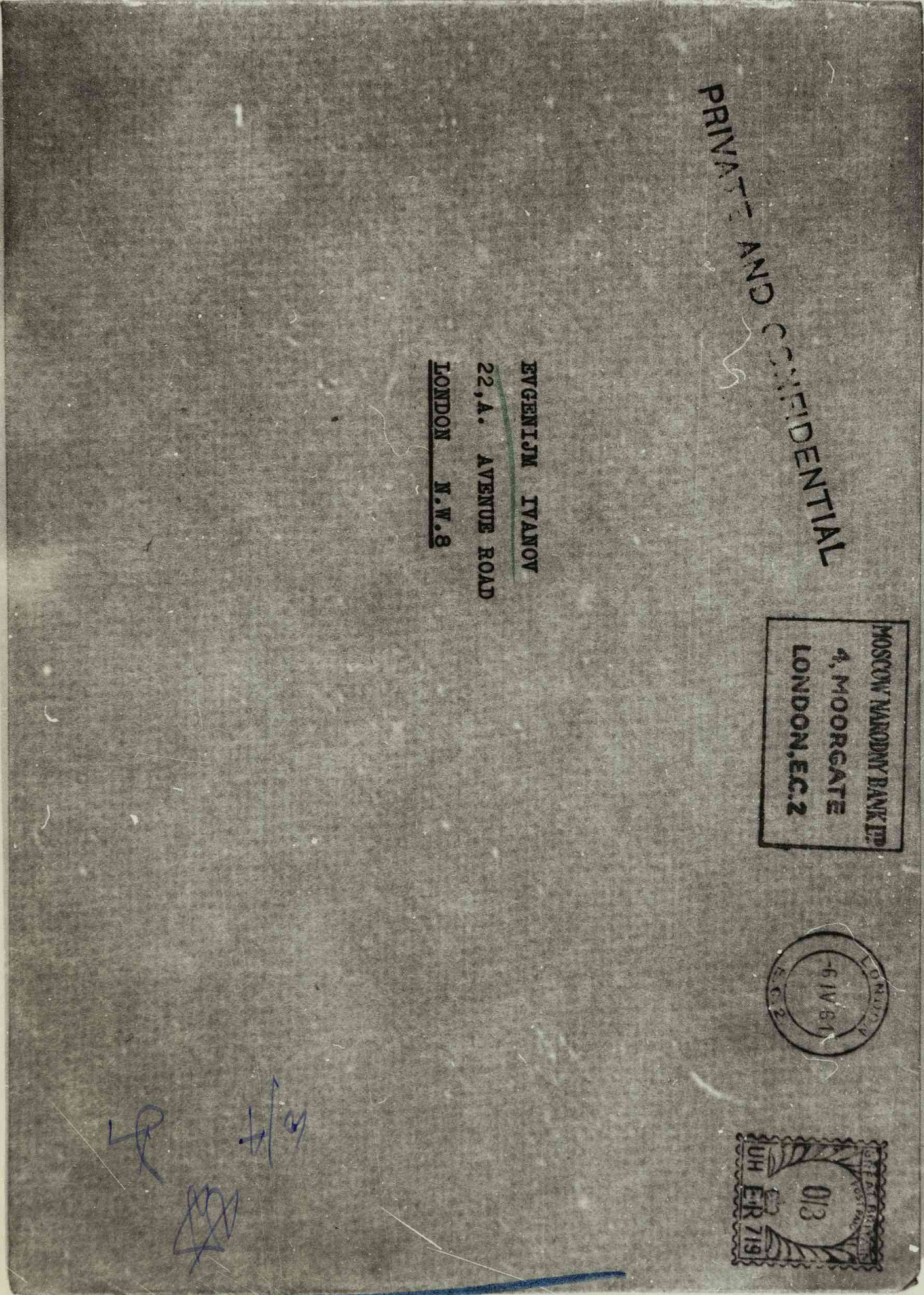
